IMAGINE A WORLD WITHOUT MUSIC...

Established as part of our anniversary celebrations, the RNCM50 Fund was launched to ensure we can fuel the aspirations of young musicians and secure the future of music. Aligned with our strategic ambitions, the fund has enabled us to support young musicians from the earliest moment, break down barriers to music education, and ensure RNCM musicians enrich communities.

Thank you to everyone who got behind us.

Support raised during 2022/23 has significantly boosted investment towards three vital RNCM projects:

1. RNCM Engage: Our innovative engagement programme nurturing musical talent in over 6,000 children and young people this year.

2. Student Support: Removing barriers to pursuing higher education in music, creating an equitable and diverse student body, and protecting 'endangered' instruments.

3. RNCM Music for Health: Training RNCM musicians to take music into special educational needs schools and children's hospitals. Using music to enhance health, wellbeing and communication for hundreds of children and young people in the North West.

RNCM50 SPECIAL SUPPORT

We were thrilled to receive some extraordinary gifts from long-term supporters and new friends to forge ahead with exciting new initiatives in our 50th year:

RNCM BRASS RECHARGE

Exceptional generosity supported a suite of activity to support brass music, with significant scholarships for key instruments, enabling us to take our expertise out to brass bands and communities through Engage Brass, and supporting the Tuba Focus Day and RNCM Brass Band Festival.

MUSIC FOR HEALTH

Seed funding launched a new training scheme to equip RNCM musicians to use music therapeutically with children with special educational needs and disabilities. Eight students went on a residential training course and have worked on projects with four North West SEND schools.

UNLOCKING OUR ARCHIVES

£206,000 was awarded for a new archive project to conserve and digitise thousands of RNCM recordings, making them publicly available online and via a new interactive heritage booth, alongside an 18-month community engagement programme.

A NIGHT TO REMEMBER

Six wonderful corporate sponsors and many loyal individuals got behind our RNCM50 Birthday Gala, raising **£65,000** to support three years of the RNCM Music for Health project, whilst enjoying a spectacular evening of music, food and dancing.

ROOF GARDEN

A generous donation enabled us to start to breathe new life into our much-loved roof garden, a secluded green space for the wellbeing of our students and staff.

Thanks to philanthropic support, we ran the RNCM String Quartet Studio – a year of full immersion string quartet training with emerging Manchester-based ensemble the Treske Quartet.



PRIZES

ENHANCING THE CONSERVATOIRE EXPERIENCE

Thanks to funds raised, we are proud to be able to offer our students opportunities to explore new and exciting pathways, broadening their learning experience and inspiring creative ambition.

WILLIAMS-HOWARD PRIZE

The second Williams-Howard Prize took place to celebrate and encourage the study and performance of art songs of composers of African heritage. **Six students** won monetary prizes, and the first prize winners additionally received mentoring and coaching, plus opportunities to perform at the RNCM and Buxton International Festival, championing underrepresented works and sharing them with new audiences.

RNCM CREATIVE INNOVATORS AWARD

The RNCM Creative Innovators Award celebrates and supports students who demonstrate creative entrepreneurship and ambition. Finalists pitched their business ideas and artistic ventures to a panel of industry experts, with **five winners** receiving financial support and mentoring to help them develop their innovative projects.

A CLOSE FAMILY OF SUPPORTERS

- A **professional development project with Northern Ballet** for conducting students, following a successful pilot last year.
- String quartet Vulva Voce, previous winners of an RNCM Creative Innovators Award, **touring sustainably across Europe**.
- Classes and activities during the **RNCM Students' Union Wellbeing Week**.
- **Performances by RNCM students in the Isle of Man** to aid recruitment of potential future students.
- Seed funding to secure a National Lottery Heritage Fund grant to **conserve and digitise thousands of archive recordings**.
- **British Sign Language workshops for students** addressing how they might make their own work more inclusive.

RNCM ENGAGE: MUSIC EDUCATION

SUPPORTING YOUNG MUSICIANS AT THE EARLIEST STAGES

In the face of growing challenges in music education, RNCM Engage offers a wide range of initiatives to kickstart musical engagement for under-18's, to help young musicians to overcome barriers, and foster talent. These initiatives are made possible thanks to vital support through donations, grants, and appeals, and are critical in providing inspirational pathways and securing the future of music.

This year, you helped to shape the lives of aspiring musicians through:

RNCM PATHFINDER

Designed to increase opportunities for children and young people aged 8-18 who are curious, full of potential and love playing music, but face financial, social, or cultural barriers to musical progression. Your generosity has helped us to reach **104** Pathfinders this year, offering free bespoke instrumental training, mentorship, and pastoral support to realise their full musical potential.

RNCM YOUNG PROJECTS

Through bespoke, instrument-specific workshops, RNCM Young Projects provide expert-led opportunities for young musicians aged 5-18, whether a beginner or more experienced, to develop their creative, musical, and technical skills, and meet other young people who play their instrument.

RNCM YOUNG ARTISTS

This new, award-winning project provides 11-18-year-olds with training and support in popular music. Supported by professional tutors and student mentors, Young Artists work in bands to create, record, and produce original music, sharing their music in friendly gigs and showcases. Generous support means that **83%** of Young Artists received full-fee bursaries.

JUNIOR RNCM

JRNCM offers world-class training to over **200** talented young musicians aged 8-18, through instrumental tuition, ensemble coaching, academic studies and much more, providing a solid platform for Higher Education level study at the RNCM or conservatoires and universities elsewhere.

We were honoured to have received several extraordinary gifts for RNCM Engage to mark our 50th anniversary:

ENGAGE APPEAL 2022

You donated an incredible **£61,000** to our annual appeal, providing vital core support for our Engage programmes and offering enriching opportunities for under-18s.

RNCM ENGAGE WEST CUMBRIA

A transformational **£1.3m** gift has enabled us to launch a new five-year project in partnership with the Cumbria Music Education Hub, providing access to world-class tuition and tailored support for thousands of children and young people, and support for Cumbrian teachers. With RNCM students playing key roles as mentors, tutors and role models, we'll encourage them to feed back into the professional music education landscape.



RNCM ENGAGE: COMMUNITY

A CHANCE TO SHINE

RNCM CHILDREN'S OPERA

A charitable grant enabled us to work with **130** children from Manchester primary schools from areas of social deprivation and low arts engagement. They devised and performed two performances of *The Snow Maiden* – a brand-new opera co-created by the children through in-school workshops – performing alongside **100** RNCM students, who gained valuable training and skills.

RNCM50 ENGAGE COMMUNITY PROGRAMME

Thanks to an extraordinary RNCM50 grant, we offered an annual programme of activity with our local community, engaging with more local people than ever to create a shared and lasting connection that establishes the RNCM at the heart of their schools and communities.

Pilot activities were also offered to provide tailored coaching for young people whose musical development was impacted by the pandemic, to catalyse their development and offer them a second chance to progress into Higher Education and access their dream of a career in music, through a new **'Transitions'** project.

SOUNDCHECK

This year, generous support enabled us to launch RNCM SOUNDCHECK, a membership scheme designed to give those aged 14–18 free access to new musical experiences at the RNCM. This scheme will offer **1,000** free tickets a year, removing barriers to a new audience.

EXPLORE@RNCM

We threw open our doors to hundreds of members of our local community for a packed day of free creative workshops and live music for all ages and tastes. The day concluded with a performance from our brand-new Community Chorus who performed Sondheim's much-loved *Into the Woods* alongside RNCM singers.

FIFTY IN 50

To engage schools with our celebrations, RNCM students performed for free in **50** local schools during the summer term – taking a plethora of styles into classrooms, offering Q&A sessions, and giving pupils the chance to learn more about life at one of the world's top conservatoires.


