### TRANSFORMATIVE PROJECTS

#### PATHFINDER

With your support we have been able to reach out, inspire and support the next generation of musical talent.

Our Pathfinder project has supported 62 talented and diverse young musicians, delivering free, tailored training to young people from disadvantaged backgrounds. Since its launch 7 students have advanced to high level tuition at our Junior school and 1 has now started a degree in Senior College, all supported with further bursaries to ensure their financial security while studying.

#### **RNCM ENTREPRENEURSHIP AWARD**

It's now more vital than ever to support our students' professional development and incubate talent and innovation.

This year's awards went ahead online, with students pitching for seed funding and the support of a mentor, for a raft of exciting new projects and businesses they're developing.

Thanks to support from the Sir John Manduell Prize, Yamaha and a major new grant from the Office for Students and Research England to expand our entrepreneurship work, we will be able to offer our students significant support to build successful and sustainable careers.



The project supports learning and skills development on a vast scale: breaking down financial and geographical barriers to musical progression, making cutting-edge higher education research and teaching accessible to all.

With your support, we've invested in high quality digital technology, enabling us to offer online tuition and support to our students and to keep reaching our audiences virtually.

Our composition students have written new work for video communication platform Zoom, our programmers have developed masterclasses with international artists and our popular lunchtime concerts have been streamed online, ensuring we have always kept the music playing.
